





ANZAC Day commemorative service

Here are a few photos from our ANZAC Day commemorative service, held at the Peace Memorial Hall. We had a great turnout with around 160 people present. Thanks to all who attended and made it our best service yet!













ANZAC Commemorative Service

This year at our ANZAC Commemorative Service we were fortunate, once again, to have Squadron Leader Craig Dalgleish be our guest speaker.

With his permission we have a transcript of this speech here. A very moving and worthwhile read. Many thanks for this, Craig.

Good afternoon, and welcome to today's ANZAC Day memorial service. Thank you to the members of the Wairau Valley Community for the invitation. I want to acknowledge our veterans, community service representatives and volunteers, especially the younger generation who have come along.

The world is, in some ways, a very different place than it was when the first ANZAC Day was marked across New Zealand in 1917.

Those first services were mainly for families of fallen service personnel—an opportunity to collectively acknowledge their grief and loss. Almost every New Zealand family had been affected in some way. In those times, the fallen were not returned home but were instead buried close to where they had died. The markers, cenotaphs and memorials throughout New Zealand are inscribed with the names of the fallen, and these were often all that the families ever had.

I have been fortunate enough to visit several historic battle sites where New Zealanders have fought. I have also seen the war graves of our fallen at places like Gallipoli, Al Elmien, and Be'er Sheva. No one can gaze at the rows of grave markers and not feel the weight of their loss. At this time of year, I often reflect on those battles that claimed so many lives and wonder if they are still remembered. What have we learnt from such human endeavour and sacrifice?

I also remember, as a younger man, reflecting on Lt Col William Malone and the Wellington Battalion at the battle for Chunuk Bair in Gallipoli—wondering why a 56-year-old solicitor from Stratford would knowingly put his life on the line with his men in such a far-off place.

His letter to his wife on the eve of the battle perhaps offers some insight:

My sweetheart, in less than 2 hours, we move off to a valley, where we will be up all night and tomorrow in readiness for a big attack.... I expect to go through all right but, dear wife, if anything untoward happens to me, you must not grieve too much. There are our dear children to be brought up. You know how I love and have loved you, and we have had many years of great happiness together.

I am prepared for death, and hope God will have forgiven me all my sins.

My desire for life, so that I may see and be with you again, could not be greater, but I have only done what every man was bound to do in our country's need. It has been a great consolation to me that you approved my action. The sacrifice was really yours. May you be consoled and rewarded by our dear Lord.

Your loving husband, W.G. MALONE

LT Col Malone fell on the 8th of August 1915 at the Battle for Chunuk Bair along with 690 members of his battalion. Only 70 survived the day.

There are so many things to learn from this story of sacrifice:

- Understanding and insight into what Military service actually means.
- The power of comradeship.
- That sacrifice is not the individual's alone, but that family also carries it.

The entire Gallipoli campaign has hopefully also taught us, as a nation, not to spend the lives of our young people too easily or entrust their command to other nations.

The years between World War 1 and now have been peppered with conflict—World War 2 would see war on an even greater scale. The Korean War, the Malayan Emergency, and the Vietnam War, to name just a few, along with contributions to Peacekeeping in Iraq, Sinai, Lebanon, Bosnia, East Timor, South Sudan, Afghanistan, and a multitude of others.

Each of these actions and operations comes at a human cost. However, they have also offered many lessons to those who are prepared to hear them.

One of the changes in ANZAC Day services over the years is that we now, also on this day, recognise the sacrifices and lives lost in all conflicts since WW1. Perhaps today we are now also acknowledging Service itself – after all, the survivors of conflict always carry scars, some visible and others not. Acknowledging this service can always be a soothing balm to those who carry those scars.

So, times might have changed – technology has certainly advanced. However, right now, wars are still being fought around the globe. New threats have emerged to our nation and its interests, from natural disasters to cyber-attacks, the threat of terrorism, and the heightened global tension over ever-shrinking resources.

Therefore, the requirement to fight for our national interests and preserve a rules-based world order have not changed. The willingness of New Zealand women and men to step up and serve their country has not changed.

Right now, around 1150 NZDF personnel are deployed overseas in training and peacekeeping roles. We know we walk in the footsteps of giants and take pride in our history, heritage, and culture.

So, what is ANZAC Day today?

It is a day for remembering and acknowledging.

From the original ANZACs to all those who have battled through all of the subsequent conflicts in which our nation has played a part, to today's young warriors.

- Those who have lost their lives,
- Those who have risked everything,
- Those who have suffered.
- The suffering and sacrifice of families, and,
- That we must learn the lessons that have come at such a heavy cost.

If happiness is a product of freedom, then freedom is the reward for courage. We should be grateful to those who have helped preserve our national ideals through sacrifice. In doing so, we keep the memories of those lives bright.

This remembrance and acknowledgement strengthens our communities.

Toku Toa he Toa Rangatira


